But within that framework? There’s a surprising amount of freedom.

The challenge is knowing when flexibility enhances the design — and when it starts working against it.

- Move plumbing-based rooms (kitchen, laundry, bathrooms)
- Extend a room beyond the original module dimensions
- Borrow layouts and features from other designs

- Want to create a completely unique layout
- Trying to combine several homes into one concept
- Need to work around extreme slope, BAL ratings, or tricky access

This isn't about saying "no" — it's about protecting your timeline, budget, and quality of outcome. The more a plan is stretched beyond its original structure, the more you move out of modular efficiency and into full custom architecture.
